



Our exam results

5+ A*-C results 2010 - 2012

This graph shows the percentage of pupils gaining 5 or more A* to C grades at GCSE or equivalent over the last 3 years.

Aug 2010 -	96%
Aug 2011 -	97%
Aug 2012 -	97%
National results 2012 -	79%

The results show that over the past 3 years the Academy has continued to significantly exceed national results for this standard.

5+ A* - C (inc English & Maths)

This graph shows the percentage of pupils gaining 5 or more A* to C grades including English and Maths at GCSE or Equivalent over the last 3 years.

Aug 2011 -	38%
Aug 2012 -	56%
National results 2012 -	58%

The results show a significant rise last year following 3 years when results remained static. The Academy results for this standard are now almost in line with national standards.

5+ A* - C (EBBAC)

This graph shows the percentage of pupils gaining 5 or more A* to C grades at GCSE which must include English Language, Maths, Triple or Double Science, History or Geography and a Modern Foreign Language over the last 3 years.

The results show a significant rise last year following 3 years when results remained static. The Academy results for this standard are now in line with national standards.

3 Levels Progress in English

This graph shows the percentage of pupils gaining who have made expected progress in English at GCSE based on their KS2 results. Level 5 expected to achieve at least grade B, Level 4 expected to achieve at least grade C, Level 3 expected to achieve at least grade D and Level 2, B or N expected to achieve at least grade E.

National results 2012 -	68%

The results show a gradual increase since over the past 3 years. The Academy results for this standard have significantly exceeded national standards over the past 3 years.

3 Levels Progress in Mathematics

This graph shows the percentage of pupils gaining who have made expected progress in Mathematics at GCSE based on their KS2 results. Level 5 expected to achieve at least grade B, Level 4 expected to achieve at least grade C, Level 3 expected to achieve at least grade D and Level 2, B or N expected to achieve at least grade E.

National results 2012 -	68%

The results remained fairly static for 3 years since 2009. However there was a significant increase in 2012 bringing the Academy results for this standard in line with national standards.

APS (Capped)

The average point score (APS) provides a fuller picture of the attainment of pupils of all abilities.

The graph shows pupils average points scores for their best 8 subjects. The total average point score (Capped) is shown with and without qualifications equivalent to GCSE.

Over the past 3 years results have risen steadily, with a slight dip in 2011. This was due changes in the curriculum where the number of GCSE subjects were increased and Vocational Equivalents qualifications reduced. Even with these changes the Academy results still significantly exceed National Standards.

Value Added

The "Value Added" figures indicate how well a school has brought on pupils from one test level to another.

This graph shows the results of the best 8 subjects including English and Mathematics within the school relative to the national mean of 1000.

Over the past 3 years results have steadily declined. This is due changes in the curriculum where the number of GCSE subjects have increased and Vocational Equivalents qualifications reduced. Even with these changes the Academy results still significantly exceed National Standards.
