Key Stage 3 (Years 7 and 8)

Not offered at Key Stage 3 level.

Key Stage 4 (Years 9, 10 and 11)

Year 9

In Year 9 we introduce students to the main themes in either Health and Social Care or Child Development. We focus on the taught elements of the course building up students' knowledge through experience and applying to the real world.

We find this gives them a good basis and grounding for the coursework which makes up the majority of each course.

Year 10

Students begin to work on their portfolios of work, putting together evidence of their competencies within each skill. Teachers support the students and there are laptops available within the department for students to write up their work.

Year 11

Students complete all coursework units by December so they can focus fully on revision of the taught content introduced to them in Year 9 for their final exam.

Health & Social Care: Key Stage 4 Cambridge Nationals are offered to our students and this is studied over 3 years comprising of 3 units of work and 1 external exam.

Child Development: Key Stage 4 GCSE OCR Child Development is offered as an option choice and this comprises of 1 individual study, 3 x resource tasks and 1 external exam.
